The Trustees works on the maintenance of FUMC property. The following are updates on recent work.

- A landscape contract was signed with Bellingers for 2021. Similar to last year, we plan to have the Youth install playground mulch which helps save approximately \$700.
- We have reduced the amount of plowing that is needed due to the lack of use of the south parking lot. This change will save about 25% off plowing costs.
- We have deployed new laptops and upgraded desktops. Funding for the computers was
 provided by the Foundation. David Caddy and Jonathan Heinz configured the computers, moved
 the accounts off of a personal server and on to Office 365, and are providing admin support.
 Their efforts allow us to cancel our service from Visual Edge IT which will save several hundred
 dollars per month.

Initially we struggled with some communication issues, but most of the technical problems have been overcome at this point. Although we had to experiment with different options and opportunities, we have now developed some consistency in our programming. While attendance is lower than we had hoped, we understand the lack of enthusiasm youth have for virtual programming and also the hesitancy to attend in-person gatherings outside of school. Many of our youth and children have been quarantined throughout the fall and winter, as well as our leaders. This influences our opportunities to do things together. Despite all of this, we do have several families participating in the options we have available.

Missions Team Report

The Missions Team formed in November and we have been very busy over the last few months. In December, we helped the LUM Jubilee which supported 35 families with Christmas gifts and gift cards for Christmas dinner. In January, we kicked off a project for a Food Finders food truck. This will take place on February 27 and will help feed approximately 140 families in the Klondike area. The most exciting thing about the food truck mission is that it spawned from a mission team member looking to make use of their stimulus check and realizing that others may be looking for a similar opportunity. To date, we've raised over \$3,000 which will fund the truck on February 27 and a second truck which we'll plan for another time this year.

When we rallied the team in the fall, we intended to make this group action-oriented, so we meet only quarterly. But like the food truck, we expect much of our work to be somewhat organic, responding to needs as we see them. We communicate primarily through email and give leeway to a project owner to make decisions and keep things moving, without the need to gather the full group. We think it's important for this to be a nimble team, constantly ready to spring into action when a need arises.

We had our second meeting in early February, where we discussed future opportunities. In addition to the many well-known missions we have supported for years, like LUM, Food Finders, Klondike Kids Club, the Backpack Program, and more, we identified a couple new opportunities to focus on that haven't been as prominent in our church in recent years. This spring, we hope to put a focus on UMCOR, communicating about the many opportunities to get involved on a number of different levels, as well as finding ways to show the impact that UMCOR has both locally and on a broader scale. Much of our work is very boots-on-the-ground, but we also want to investigate ways to get involved with Bread for the World, an organization more focused on making systemic changes.
