# **Trustees Corner**

## **Behind the Scenes: Streaming Production at FUMC**


Many of us have enjoyed being able to sit at home & watch the worship services online, but few know how much upgrading equipment & infrastructure has been done behind the scenes to make streaming each week possible.

Remember back to the first livestream service we had after Covid started in March 2020? Our video & sound quality badly needed improvement. The Governance Board decided to invest \$15,000 to upgrade the church's video equipment. In addition, FUMC applied for & received a \$5,000 technology grant from the Center for Congregations. Those monies were used to buy the video equipment needed to produce the quality streaming service we now enjoy.


However, this additional equipment did not fit in the existing AV booth, plus it is difficult to mix the sound for a video stream when you are in the same room where the service is happening. Two members of the Trustee Team (Jonathan Heinz & David Caddy) came up with a plan to convert the storeroom next to the AV Booth to an isolated video production room where they can hear & see the video the way you see it when you watch it at home.

This new Video Production Room is now key to livestreaming & will become even more important when we go back to in-person & streaming. Members of the tech team run the equipment in the AV Booth to control what goes on in the sanctuary, while additional tech team members operate the equipment in the video booth to control the streaming video.

Both rooms were painted, & acoustic treatments were added to the Video Production Room. David & Jonathan installed all the video, audio, & network wiring in the AV booth & Video Production Room to bring it up to current standards, while Don Caddy added some additional electrical outlets. David & Jonathan set up desks & shelving for the equipment, built the computers needed, & installed & configured all the equipment & software that we use every Sunday. Donations covered the cost of the carpet, paint, shelving, & lighting. The result is not only very functional but looks good as well.

Jonathan & David did all this work over the past year, each of them putting in hundreds of hours while keeping the system functioning every Sunday morning to stream the worship service. To put that in some perspective, that would be like telling your kitchen remodeling contractor that every evening you need all the appliances to work so you can fix dinner. It was not always pretty during the renovation & installation, but the results are worth it. Few churches are blessed with young people like this who are willing to volunteer so much of their time & have the necessary skills to put together this level of production facility while still attending school full time & holding down additional jobs.

If you get a chance once we are in the building again, come check out the Video Production Room & AV Booth. And if you see Jonathan or David around, let them know you appreciate their contributions to FUMC.

# **That Warm Feeling You had Last Winter**

You can thank the FUMC Foundation for that. The Foundation is an independent organization that invests donations to support the work of FUMC. Not all that support is very glamorous, but it is all necessary. Last winter (you remember – before Covid when we all got dressed up & went to Church) the furnace for the Sanctuary failed. We managed to get it going but it was rusted out to the point of being no longer trustworthy. A new furnace that size is over \$10,000 which was not in the budget. The Foundation approved funding for a new furnace & we now have a new furnace for the Sanctuary. The new one includes stainless steel components so that we can get a longer life out of it.

Most of you missed the experience this summer when one of the Air Conditioning compressors failed. Our worship team spent a couple very warm Sundays putting on the service while we figured out the problem. The culprit was a failed compressor on the Sanctuary Condenser unit. A new compressor installed was almost \$11,000 & the current budget does not have any extra money in it. The Foundation stepped in again & reallocated some funds to pay for the new compressor. Next summer when we are back in our seat in the Sanctuary remember to thank the Foundation for the cool temperatures inside.
